

Professor (Wakan Patriot Dream, RL1, RN, NW3) got his NW3 title on June 6, 2014. This is the Nosework 3 title, awarded by the National Association of Canine Scent Work (NACSW). There are fewer than 120 dogs in the country that have passed this test, which involves searching 4 areas (interior, exterior, containers, and vehicles) for any of 3 scents or any combination of those scents. Handlers don't know how many hides are in each search area. In interiors, there are 3 rooms, and one of them may have no scent hide at all. The dog must tell the handler, and the handler must correctly call each search finished. I am incredibly proud of my little man, the first basenji to get the NW3 title.
